Individuals in need of an immediate assessment, include:

- 1. People actively using opioids and people who are actively using alcohol and/or benzodiazepines in a pattern (frequency, amount and duration) that is likely to require a medical assessment for withdrawal. If the screen is positive, the individual should be seen on the same day by clinical/medical staff to assess the severity of potential withdrawal and identify who can initiate treatment.
- 2. Pregnant IV user
- 3. Pregnant users
- 4. IV users
- 5. Patients at risk of losing custody of their child
- 6. Patients recently released from the criminal justice system

If the screen is negative for urgent or emergency need – the individual and/or family member should be given an intake appointment within 72 hours.
